2005 Woodcutter's Shiraz

The name Woodcutter's stems from when Torbreck Founder David Powell spent several years working in the Scottish Highlands as a lumberjack or woodcutter in the Torbreck forest.

This is just a reflection of the up and coming younger Shiraz vineyards of the Barossa, rather than the battle hardened old warriors which make up the heart and soul of the of the established Torbreck range.

2005 WOODCUTTERS SHIRAZ

VARIETAL: 100% Shiraz

REGIONS: North-Western Barossa Valley.

HARVEST: Mid to late April 2005

pH: 3.82

TA: 6.35g/L

ALCOHOL: 14.5% Alc/Vol

FERMENTATION: Like all Torbreck wines, the fruit sourced for the Woodcutters Shiraz is from hand harvested, hand tended, low yielding vines. It is fermented and gently basket pressed, then aged for 12 months in large format, old French oak foudre.
